## Profile of a Hayes Track Alumnus:

### Langdon 'Butch' Soares '74

When Langdon "Butch" Soares turned on his television last November and learned that sub-twenty-degree wind chills were pummeling the adventurous souls running in the New York City

Marathon, he felt a shudder of sympathy. Although three thousand miles and twenty-plus years removed from his days as a student at Cardinal Hayes High School, he still recalled those frigid winter workouts on the wooden track behind the school.

Now settled in Los Angeles County for over ten years with his wife, Althea, a mere stone's throw from the city limits, Butch has also traveled light years in terms of career and education. After graduating from Hayes in 1974, he went on to earn a Bachelor of Science in 1978 and a Master of Business Administration in 1982, both from Cornell University. His interests in engineering and business have led him to take a variety of positions, including test engineer for IBM in upstate New York, product engineer for Ford Motors in Detroit, industrial engineer for Mercy, Sharp and Dome in a Philadelphia suburb, and strategic planning analyst for a defense company in Redondo Beach, just outside of Los Angeles. He is now marketing manager for business development operations at Hughes Aircraft in Los Angeles, where he does market research on potential competitors. His unit makes military radar and electronics for aircraft fighters and bombers. His is a position that continues to evolve as the company restructures in response to changes in the shrinking defense industry.

While Butch has a varied work background and extensive educational pursuits, there is a framework upon which his success has rested: his high school education. "You would be surprised at how often I fall back on my education at Hayes," Butch remarked recently. He regards

Hayes as a stepping-stone for students from all parts of New York. At Hayes they can acquire several attributes that Butch still finds invaluable. One he particularly appreciates is the self-discipline that was instilled in him by the faculty. Self-discipline, he observes, is something that is reflected in simple things like arriving at work on time. As for the dress code that Hayes is well known for, that is something that Hayes has long adopted to. His Company has "casual Fridays" on which employees are invited to "dress down." Butch still comes in wearing a jacket and tie. "I feel comfortable dressed up," he admits.

Another valuable lesson Butch learned while at Hayes was how to do independent research. Teachers like Mr. Bill Kerrigan taught him how to use the vast resources of libraries to locate specific information. He put this to good use not only in his professional life but also when he and his wife wanted to pinpoint the best surgeon for a specific medical need.

Butch also praises the steadfast dedication of the faculty to the students. He recalls a visit to Cornell University during his senior year at Hayes. Excited by the opportunity, he forgot to inform the school that he would be out that day. In the evening, still euphoric over his visit, he received a call from Father Ansaldi, the Dean of Discipline. He happily told the priest what had happened. "That's great," Father Ansaldi responded. "But you should have called to let us know you would be out."

Butch credits the demands of the school and his participation on the track team with helping to keep him out of trouble. Growing up in the Williamsbridge section of the Bronx when people his age were joining gangs, he simply had no time to get into trouble. In a typical school day, he left for Hayes a 7:30 in the morning, attended classes, went to track practice, and arrived home around 6:30 PM, at which time he would eat dinner and then study. The next day he would do it all over again. Recently, Butch visited a local high school and was surprised to see students milling about the corridors during school hours unsupervised. "This didn't happen at Hayes!" he says.

His pursuits as a runner have come full circle. At Hayes, he was a member of the cross-country team that still holds the school record for

the fastest five man average time, something like 13:58. It included Rick Morales and Oscar Armero. During track season, he concentrated on the mile, although he ran mostly quarters and halves his first two years. (In fact, he ran a 49-second quarter in the Penn Relays in his senior year.) He remembers the helpful, sometimes pointed, advice from one of his coaches, Ed Robinson. ("That was a great 660. Too bad you forgot you were running a half.") At Cornell, he ran quarters mostly and some halves, breaking 1:55 in the half and hitting fifty seconds in the quarter. Now, as middle age approaches, he has tackled four marathons in New York and Los Angeles, although as he is quick to point out, nowadays he runs more for stress relief and less for competition. "My objective when running a marathon is simply to finish it and walk away on my own two feet," he admits. He is thinking of running one for his fortieth birthday in '96, if his knees permit.

Butch rejects the stereotype of New Yorkers as pushy and callous and Angelenos as laid back and indifferent. "If anyone had such an image, it would have been shattered if he or she had ever run in the New York and LA Marathons," he says, referring to events known as much for their spectators as for their participants. Butch has run two marathons in each city and has fond memories of them. Part of the New York Marathon route passes over the Queensboro Bridge onto First Avenue. Butch remembers his run over the bridge itself as an exercise in solitude, but as the runners made their way onto First Avenue, they were met by the roar of the crowd lining the street, a greeting that continued all the way to Lenox Hill. Butch traded high fives with some of the crowd, and after the race he was surprised by the number of people on the subway who asked him if he was all right, offered him their seats, and congratulated him on finishing.

One specific incident seemed to lay the image of the uncaring New Yorker to rest. It occurred in the 1992 Marathon, when Butch finished just ahead of Fred Lebow, the founder of the Marathon, who had recently been diagnosed with a brain tumor. As Butch approached the finish line, he heard the crowd give a thundering round of applause to Lebow as a sign of recognition of what he meant to the city.

Butch has long believed in the importance of family and community ties. As often as he can, he visits his mother and sister, who still live in the same section of the Bronx where he grew up. In Los Angeles, he has been treasurer of his local church and a participant in the Rebuild Crenshaw Youth Motivational Task Force, which was developed after the '92 riots. At present, he is a member of the Hughes Black Employee Network and the Black Professional Forum, and he is on the board of Crenshaw Neighbors, an organization dedicated to pursuing common goals among the residents of Los Angeles' Crenshaw district.

Although Butch is now a veteran Angeleno, he still retains his New York identity and roots. And while his Bronx accent may have softened somewhat and he is at ease out on the West Coast, he will never really be far from those Bronx streets of his youth.

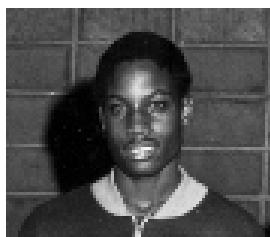

## ABOUT THE '96 TEAMS:

Cardinal Hayes had a very satisfying finish at the Outdoor Championships. The coaches report that, although they had a small team, they always challenged the larger teams in scoring, which meant that their individual accomplishments were outstanding. Their X-Country team started out strong- getting over a dozen freshmen involved in track immediately. With the return of their entire relay teams and high jumping group, as well as a more experienced group of hurdlers, the Hayes coaches feel really good about their chances of taking home team trophies in the '95-96 seasons.

Fieldston's Varsity Winter Track team is a small, dedicated and determined group of runners. The team is composed mostly of distance runners who thrive on long road races. They enter most of the NY Road Runner Winter Series races in Central Park. The team does very well, winning several age group medals and an occasional team medal.

In the fall and spring they compete in the IVY Prep league and have always finished strongly.

They will be competing in several indoor meets this winter (This will be their first.) and they're looking forward to making their mark!

Fordham Prep fielded a team that won the Bronx X-Country Championships this past fall for the seventh straight year and finished seventh in the CHSAA X-Country City Championships, and its Jr. Varsity won the NY Sectional X-Country Championships.

On the individual level, Juniors Todd Young and Rich Hinman competed in the State Federation Meet and the team boasted of thirteen runners breaking fifteen minutes for the Van Cortlandt Park two-and-a-half mile course.

On the track, the Prep has a strong well-balanced team of sprinters, hurdlers, field events men and distance runners. Robert Weitzman returns as a 1:24 600 meter man. Bill Mathaikutty and Jason Macias return as CHSAA 55 Meter Hurdles finalists, and Gordon Lewis returns as a 21 foot long-jumper.

The Frosh show as much depth and strength as the Varsity, led by 5'6" High Jumper Jim Corbett, Hurdlers Deric Zaphire and Matt Keller and miler Dave Fernandez.

Mount Saint Michael used the Bronx Championships to launch one of their most successful years in their long history of track & field. For the first time since 1947, they won the Indoor Catholic High Schools City Championships and then followed it up with the Outdoor Championship! Coach Len Diaz, a former Mount star and Catholic City Champ himself, says his chances of repeating are good since only one runner who scored in the meet last year has been lost to graduation. Even their 1600 Meter Relay, which placed fourth in the Nationals last winter with a time of 3:22, returns three of the four legs.

Howard Sterling has already turned in times of 49.8 for the 400 meters, 1:21.7 for the 600 meters and 1:56.5 for the 800 meters, and the season is not yet a month old.

It's still early but there are whispers of a dynasty in the Bronx!

Xavier is once again growing to be a factor in the NY CHSAA! This past X-Country season saw the team with its best finish in both the NY Sectional Championships (second) and in the CHSAA City Championships (sixth). Senior captain Brendan Brouder set the school X-Country record of 13:18. The prospects for indoor and outdoor are very bright as Senior Captain Kevin Hanovich leads the Middle Distance group with an 800 meter time of 1:59 already this year. This year Hanovich, Brouder, Senior Joe Monohan and Junior James Carroll are looking to set the school record in the 4x800 Meter relay. The foursome recently set the school record in the Distance Medley at the Brown Invitational. Other returning Varsity lettermen who are looking to make an impact this year are Seniors Ed Ham, Joe Gonzalez, Sal Hoo and Dave Carrieras, Juniors Kevin Maloy, Tim Faughnan, Ryan O'Shea, Andres Agard and Tony Frana. The Sophomores are led by Steven Caraballo, Greg Aleksey, Chris Brunetti, Peter Perieria, John Murphy, Pat Keane, Kirk Bramble and Pat McGoldrick.

# A LOOK BACK:

## "Cardinal Hayes-Sponsored Track &Field Meet Draws Rave Reviews in the Bronx"

Mount St. Michael won top honors in the Varsity Division of the 1965 Bronx Catholic Boys High School Track & Field Championship at Draddy Gymnasium, Manhattan College on January 18th, in a meet that is sure to fuel a healthy rivalry among seven competitive Bronx high school teams. Propelled by their strong showing in the sprint events and relays, Mount scored 66 points to Fordham Prep's 52. Cardinal Hayes placed third with 32 points. Fred Ketter and Joshua Cruz of Mount took first and third in the Varsity 55 meter dash with times of 6.5 and 6.7 seconds. The most hotly contested race of the day was the Varsity 1600 meter relay in which Mount placed both first and third with times of 3:37.6 and 3:38.5. Fordham Prep took second with a time of 3:38.2.

In the Freshman section of the meet, Cardinal Hayes' dominance in the field events proved enough to secure first place by two points (52-50) over Fordham Prep. Mount St. Michael placed third with 31 points. Richard Castro, Phil Bernal and Robert Young placed first, second and third in the triple jump to give Hayes a sweep of this event. Robert Frierson of Hayes took first place in the Freshman High Jump.
