Profile of a Hayes Track

Alumnus:

Ed Robinson — Class of '61

Poets, philosophers, and sociologists alike have recognized the impact seemingly minor decisions have in shaping one's life. When Ed Robinson decided to attend Cardinal Hayes High School, his decision was based on very practical considerations: He was graduating from St. Thomas the Apostle grammar school and was not intimidated by Hayes's reputation as a very strict school. Also, he lived in North Harlem, just a few train stops away from that imposing building on the Grand Concourse. The decision was to play a pivotal role in the friendships he would develop, his career choices, and the things he would give priority to in his life.

Once at Hayes, Ed made another choice that would influence his future: He joined the track team. He ran for three of his four years at Hayes, skipping his sophomore year. He concentrated almost exclusively in the 220-yard run, experimenting now and then with the 100 and doing his best to avoid running the 440 completely. (Ed does admit to running one 440, maintaining that "I thought I was going to die during the race.") He ran a personal best official time of 22.9 seconds for the 220 on a cinder track.

Despite the fact that he considered himself a second-tier runner on a very good team, his accomplishments were noteworthy. But more important than his success as a runner were the friends he made on the team. He still keeps in contact with running mates such as Roy Howe, Rich Kenney, and Tom Ryan.

Ed graduated from Hayes in 1961 and went to Iona College. Still smitten with the running bug, he joined the track team as a walk-on, but he learned after a few weeks of practice and competition that he was being outmatched by his teammates, virtually all of whom had track scholarships. Brother Doyle, Iona's track coach, observing the same thing, offered him the position of track manager. Ed did much more than that title suggested. Just one of his duties was organizing the trips to track meets, an often overlooked but essential job in any sports team that consisted of arranging for transportation to meets and scheduling overnight stays. (Just ask any athlete who has been unable to compete because the proper accommodations had not been made.) It was as team manager,

he now admits, tongue planted firmly in cheek, "that my coaching talents showed early."

Ed took five years to graduate from Iona College. He contemplated many majors and even concentrated on a pre-med background before eventually earning a degree in economics. Then he secured a job at Rice High School, using his pre-med background to teach biology. He was also offered a job as freshman track coach—quite a leap from team manager, and an opportunity he could not refuse. Some of the teams he coached were outstanding. One won the Catholic High School Freshman Outdoor Championship, and others won cross-country championships. Among the dominating runners Ed coached were Vinny O'Dwyer and Dennis Fikes. Dennis Fikes eventually became the first black American runner to break the four-minute mile.

Ed left Rice after three years, taking a coaching and teaching job at Hayes. Although he was proud of his success in establishing the Rice freshman squads as respected members of New York's high school running community, he also realized he would never be given the chance to coach varsity teams. Joe O'Keefe, a well-regarded track coach, had been commanding the varsity squad for many years, and the odds that he would give it up soon were slim.

More than anything, Ed wanted the chance to coach a varsity track team that Hayes offered him. In addition, reuniting with past teachers and school administrators such as Bernie Gallagher, the athletic director, Father Robertson, and Monsignor Peters had a special appeal.

While at Hayes, Ed became the meet director for the Hayes Games. This was the largest indoor high school meet in the United States. It involved over 3,000 competitors and took two days to run. As if this wasn't enough of a challenge, at about the same time he also became meet director for the Iona Relays, an outdoor meet every bit as ambitious and challenging as the Hayes Games.

Eventually, Ed took time off from his teaching and coaching careers and went back to graduate school to pursue a doctorate in education at Columbia. His long-range goal was to stay in the teaching profession in an administrative capacity. But he dropped out of the program, realizing that being an administrator was too far removed from the classroom.

Once again turning to Catholic high schools, Ed decided to teach at Mt. St. Michael next. This time he concentrated exclusively on teaching,

once again biology. But this third school was not a charm to prevent the burnout from years of teaching that ate at his spirit. He quit teaching altogether and set his sights on another career. He became an underwriter at an insurance company.

Perhaps the job at the insurance company recharged his teaching batteries, or maybe Ed's need to teach could never be completely stifled. Whatever the reason, he tried career counseling at Iona and taught freshman science courses part-time. But Ed soon discovered that politics played too much of a role in the teaching profession at the college level, so he went back to insurance work. But moving from a job as an underwriter to corporate training, he realized that his coaching and teaching had filled a void in his life not possible with his current job. Put simply, he missed contact with kids. By this time, he had acknowledged that he would probably never get married, so he made a decision that was as frightening in its demand for responsibility and commitment as it was selfless: He decided to adopt. Firmly committed though with reasonable reservations, he visited an older-child adoption agency. That April, he adopted Sammy. Soon afterwards, the adoption counselors asked him if he was willing to adopt a second boy, and David became his second son in December. Both boys were sixteen.

In addition to the problems that would confront any single parent, there were special considerations. The children and Ed had to deal not only with the normal problems of adolescence, but also with feelings of rejection fostered by separation from their families. In addition, Sammy had a learning disability and needed tutoring. There were times when Ed felt isolated from the rest of the world. He often had a need to talk to someone outside when there was a problem, to ask who they thought was crazy when he and the boys disagreed on something. "Of course," Ed now admits, "I expected to be told that it was the boys who were crazy."

However, Ed gradually learned to be a parent, often depending on the guidance of friends along the way. The teacher had taken on the role of willing student. And the willing student was obviously a good learner. David finished high school and attended Brooklyn College. Sammy moved out on his own.

But the feelings of pride and pleasure Ed felt as a parent were hideously shattered one morning, when he received a phone call informing him that Sammy had died, at the age of 22, the victim of an asthma attack. David was deeply affected by his brother's death and

eventually dropped out of college. But he joined the Air Force, got married, and soon became the proud father of two boys of his own.

Today, Ed continues a relatively comfortable career in the corporate world. He helps write manuals for the insurance company's computer system, which is used for tracking, rating, and issuing insurance. He visits his grandchildren at their home in Florida, and they in turn come north to visit him in New Jersey. He maintains ties to his childhood neighborhood through his parents, who still live there.

Ed also plays an indispensable role in the Hayes Alumni Track Association, using his organizational skill to run the Cardinal Hayes High School Track & Field Invitational. Although still lingering in the shadow cast by the original Cardinal Hayes Games, this is a meet that is gaining popularity among New York high school runners, attracting more schools each year. Ed puts the Hayes Invitational in a reasonable perspective, viewing it more as a way for the alumni to foster athletic spirit than as a showcase for athletes or as a means of raising money.

It has become clear to Ed that the impetus for many of the commitments he made in his life stemmed from his involvement with the track team. "When I joined the team, I felt that I was becoming part of something bigger than myself, he says. "It was a rite of passage in which I went from just being a kid in North Harlem to becoming part of an expanded world." In that world, he developed friendships that remain as vibrant today as they did over thirty years ago. He has come to realize that decisions made by kids do have long-range effects. "When I joined the team as a kid, I didn't expect it to still be with me at the age of 54," he admits. And it should be noted that the former student and competitor turned teacher and coach has over the years himself played a role in decisions made by hundreds of other students and runners.

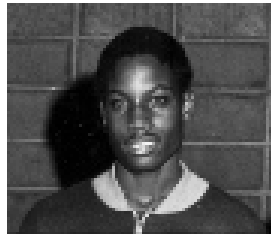

In a repeat of their strong showing last year, Fordham Preparatory High School dominated the Third Annual Cardinal Hayes Invitational & Bronx Catholic High School Track & Field Championships on Thursday, January 9, at Draddy Gym, at Manhattan College. Fordham won all team honors in the meet, including the overall Hayes Invitational and the Bronx Catholic High School Championship in both the Freshman and Varsity divisions.

In the Hayes Invitational overall scoring, Fordham scored 67 points to Mount Saint Michael's 61.5. Rice High School placed third with 14 points. In the Freshman scoring, Fordham accumulated 65 points to Mount St. Michael's 37.5 points. Xavier scored 24 points. Cardinal Hayes placed third in both the Varsity and Freshman sections of the Bronx Catholic High School Championships.

Highlights of the meet included a tied meet record of 36.7 seconds in the Varsity 300 Meter Run by Sean Wright of Rice, and a near meet record of 39 feet , 2 inches in the Varsity Triple Jump by Landon Dais * of Fordham. Wright also won the Varsity 55 Meter Dash in 6.6 seconds. Fordham won three top spots in the Freshman 55 Meter High Hurdles, with Jason Seiden, Chris Ditata, and Chris Van Metter placing one, two, and three. Rich Keelig of Hayes won the Freshman 300 Meter Run with a time of 39.7 seconds. The most popular race of the day was the Varsity 1600 Meter Relay, with Mount's "A" and "B" teams placing first and second, and Cardinal Spellman Third.

This Meet, organized by the Cardinal Hayes Track Alumni, has become increasingly more popular with the private and Catholic high schools.

CONFUSED ABOUT METRICS?

It's been twenty, thirty, even forty years since you looked at times, and now they've gone and changed the size of the tracks and changed the distances so that the times don't mean anything! Here's a rough guide to help you through the meet. Just be grateful that we do not have Fully Automatic Timing, which adds another set of calculations.

A LOOK AT A FEW OF THE TEAMS AS THEIR COACHES SEE THEM

Archbishop Stepinac is a first time participant to the Invitational and is led by its Senior captain, Jon Scott. Last year he ran a 4:40 mile and is coming off a fine 13:38 cross-country performance. Combined with two Juniors 800 meter men, Anthony Saglimbene who ran 2:03 year and Chris Ellis who ran 2:05, as well as Carlos Bedoya, who was the Freshmen 400 meter champion in both the Sectional and Intersectional Championships last spring, and Stepinac should field a strong 3200 Meter Relay.

Senior Eric Solivan who ran 54.4 last year should help the 1600 Meter Relay. Sprinters Eric Hulbert, Anthony Bellino and Matt Cerbone should score in the shorter events. Other key trackmen include Steve Boda, Justin Mera, Anthony Daronzio, Matt Melello, Matt Hartnett, Joji Kitura, Justen Medina and Omar Francis.

Collegiate won its eighth consecutive Ivy Prep School League X-Country Championships and were N.Y.S. Independent School Champions. Seniors Tim Bartholomaus, Arturo Espinoza and A. Haber along with Juniors Chris Yip and Chris Kolenaty will continue their efforts indoors. Our Freshmen team had strong performances at the Manhattan College Invitational (2nd) and the Brown Invitational (3rd). Jared Lister and Steven Rahl led the way with help from David Crow and Ryan Wade.

Team goals are to defend as Ivy League Indoor Champions and win a fifth consecutive Outdoor Championship. The sprinters will be led by Senior David Crow and Sophomore Ney Castro. Brent Boyce continues to improve in the hurdles and looks strong. Emmett Tracy and Janos Martin will contribute in the middle distance events. Sophomore Billy parish will provide added depth in the distance events. In the shot, Senior Chris martin seeks to qualify for the state meet again and break the fifty foot mark.

Fordham Prep is the two-time defending Hayes Invitational champion as well as the Bronx CHSAA Champion. They won the Soph CHSAA Indoor City meet in '97 and are coming off their win in the New York Sectional Cross-Country Championships this past fall. For good measure, they won their ninth straight Bronx Cross-Country Championship.

This season they are led by a Junior, Daryn Johnson who has run 9:43 for the 3200 meters and 4:31 for the mile. Prep has a solid crop of distance runners, many top hurdlers and field men with a growing Pole Vault program. Finally, there is a Freshmen team of more than fifty men to back them up.

Regis had three men, William Berriel, Thomas Lennon and Roy Pierson, under 14:00 this past cross-country season, so they are expecting the Distance Medley to be their best event this year. Pierson or Berriel would be expected to run the 1200 meters, James Murphy (51.0) the 400 meters, Russell Capone or Mark Waase in the 800 meters, and Thomas Lennon (hopefully around 4:30) in the 1600 meters.

Last year's Distance medley and Two Mile Relays consisting of seniors made the finals of the Millrose games and the finals of the Penn Relays Championships in both relays. They climaxed their season with a tenth place finish and a 7:53 school record in the finals of the 3200 Meter Relay at the National Championship

NOTES:

Rice High School's Sean Wright tied the Invitational record while winning the 300 meters, then went on to several fine performances during the indoor and outdoor seasons. Among his achievements as a Junior, were victories in the Indoor Catholic Championships and the Outdoor Catholic Championships, where he was named the MVP. His most outstanding achievement, however, was the cracking of the CHSAA oldest record on the books. His 47.19 for 400 meters broke John Quigley's record set in 1939!

His winning ways continue. On December 28, he posted a 49.72, an indoor CHSAA record, to win the Chase Christmas Festival. Again, he broke Quigley's record.

Remember the 4:00 mile? It is still the standard in most people's minds of a major achievement for any middle distance runner, even though it was broken in 1954. This past summer three runners shattered the 8:00 mark for the two mile run, with the best being a 7:55! That's 3:57 per mile for two consecutive miles.

We are happy to welcome Collegiate of NYC and Archbishop Stepinac of White Plains, as they compete for the first time. They join Cardinal Hayes, Mount Saint Michael, Cardinal Spellman, Saint Raymond and Fordham Prep, all of the Bronx, and Xavier and Regis. Rice and Fieldston are expected at the starting line, and there may be one or two others.
